School

Forest Park High School is a four-year school in the Clayton County Public School System enrolling 1,750 students in grades 9-12.

Vision

The vision of Clayton County Public Schools is to prepare ALL graduates to have the skills to pursue and accomplish college, post-secondary training, and/or career opportunities in order to live and compete successfully in a global society.

Mission

The mission of Clayton County Public Schools is to empower scholars to achieve academic, professional, and personal goals by providing equitable access and experiences that build skills in literacy, creativity, critical thinking, and collaboration.

Curriculum

The **academic program** is organized in a block schedule. Four credits per semester is the maximum course load (unless a student participates in dual enrollment); students take 90-minute classes daily.

These AP courses are offered: Art Studio (2D and 3D), English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Environmental Science, Government and Politics, US History, Human Geography, World History, Computer Science, Economics, Biology, Chemistry, and Physics.

Honors classes are offered in Biology, 9th grade English, World Literature, Chemistry, and ROTC.
