What is Title I?

Forest Park High School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging State academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it? Forest Park High School will link goals of school to the school improvement plan for student academic achievement. We will describe how teachers will help develop those skills using high quality education in the areas of English, Math, Science, Social Studies and through the EOPA program for CCRPI. We will involve parents of the progress of their students through regular two-communication via email, telephone, parent-teacher conferences, etc.

How is it revised? Forest Park High School welcomes parent input and comments at any time regarding the plan. All parent feedback will be used to revise the plan for next year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and post feedback throughout the year. We also distribute an annual survey online, by e-mail and as a hand-out to every student, to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parent involvement. Parents can also give feedback during our Annual Title I meeting, School council meetings, School Improvement Plan meeting, and at our Family Friendly walkthrough with school leaders to revise the plan for the upcoming school year.

Who is it for? All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Forest Park High School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available? At the beginning of the year, the plan is completed with parental input in an open meeting. As a reminder, we will send a message via school messenger to every home prior to the implementation of the plan.
